




## PROJECT DATA

### Location

Hugo Lake's project boundaries spans the border of Pushmataha and Choctaw counties in scenic southeastern Oklahoma with the lake and dam located in the latter. Hugo Dam is located on the Kiamichi River at 17.6 river miles upstream from its confluence with the Red River. Hugo Dam is the only dam that impounds the Kiamichi River and is approximately seven miles east of the town of Hugo, Oklahoma and 30 miles north of Paris, Texas. The project was authorized by the 1946 and 1962 Flood Control Acts for flood control, water supply, fish and wildlife management, and recreation. On October 6, 1969, Public Law 86-88 was approved by Congressional Committees to add storage for water quality to the project's purpose. Construction of the project began in November 1967 and closure of the embankment was completed by October 29, 1971. Impoundment of the lake began on January 18, 1974, and reached the normal conservation pool on March 12, 1974.

### Day Use

The Corps offers several boat ramps, 3 designated swim beaches, and many picnic sites. Fees for use of the facilities should be paid to the attendant when on duty or by using the self-deposit honor vault when the park attendant is absent. An annual Day Use Pass is available for purchase which permits the vehicle and accompanying passengers to use all boat launching ramps and swimming beaches at all Corps-operated recreation areas without further charges. ### Hunting and Fishing

Public hunting lands are managed by the Corps of Engineers and the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation. Hunting and fishing are regulated by State and Federal laws, and state hunting and fishing licenses are required. Corps of Engineers hunting maps are available at:

## RECREATION

### Camping

The Corps operates 2 Class A campgrounds on Hugo Lake. Park attendants oversee fee collection during the peak season in most parks. Self-deposit honor vaults are available for use during the off-season and in campgrounds without park attendants. Entrance gates open at 6 a.m. and lock at 10 p.m. Camping is prohibited in undesignated areas.

#### Rules & Regulations

Copies of Title 36 Rules and Regulations governing the public use on Corps of Engineers Projects are available upon request.

**Occupancy:** The maximum number of people per site is 8. Only one RV is allowed per site. The number of tents is limited by the space available at each camp site and the size of tents.

**Length of stay:** No camping unit will be allowed to stay longer than 14 consecutive days in any one park without written permission. Extensions will not be granted through any summer holiday weekend.

**Vehicles:** All vehicles must be street legal with tags, stay on established roads, and be operated by a licensed driver.

**Animals:** All pets must be restrained by a leash less than six feet in length. Animals are prohibited in restrooms and at designated swim beaches.

**Fireworks:** Possessing or exploding fireworks on government property is prohibited.

**Noise:** Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. - 6 a.m. Unreasonable or excessive noise/music at any time is prohibited.

**Garbage:** Dumpsters are consolidated in a central location within each campground. Take all camping generated refuse to the dumpsters. Bagged trash will not be collected at the campsites. Fire rings and grills are not to be used as trash bins.

**Sewage and Gray Water:** The improper disposal of these are prohibited. All such matter shall be disposed of properly at the dump station.

**Registration:** All campers and their visitors must check in with the gate attendant at the park office.

**Reservations:** Check-In by 6 p.m.  
Check-Out by 4 p.m.

### Reservations

Camping reservations can only be made for dates during the peak season. The reservations can be made in person at the gate shack or through the **National Recreation Reservation Service (NRRS)** which provides a nationwide reservation system for many state and federally managed facilities.



### Swimming Safety:

- No lifeguards provided. Swim at your own risk.
- Learn how to swim.
- Swim at designated beach areas.
- Never swim alone. Swim with a buddy.
- Watch children closely.
- When storms approach...get out of the water and stay out.
- Don't overestimate your swimming ability as water distances are deceiving.

### Boating Safety:

- Take a boating safety course.
- Obey all state and federal boating regulations.
- Head for shore if bad weather threatens.
- Be watchful for obstructions in the water. Take extra care in shallow water and along the shoreline.
- There is no entry allowed beyond the buoy lines above and below Denison Dam.

It's the **LAW**..Children under 13 years of age **MUST WEAR** an approved Personal Floatation Device (PFD) whenever underway on a vessel less than 26 feet in length.
