

HUNTING GUIDE

FALL RIVER LAKE

Hunting at Fall River Lake is in accordance with applicable Federal and state regulations. Generally, all Corps lands are open to the public for hunting except developed recreational areas and lands around the dam and other structures.

Hunters are urged to exercise the basic rules of good sportsmanship, safety, and common sense.

Vehicles may be driven only on established roads.

Camping is restricted to designated campsites within developed camping areas.

Fires are allowed only in designated fire rings or grills.

Only temporary duck blinds are authorized and they must be removed after each hunting trip.

Hunters are reminded that if a wildlife violation is observed, it should be reported to the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks by calling "Operation Game Thief" at 1-877-426-3843.



HUNTING HINTS

- Handle every gun as if it were loaded.
- Be sure of your target and what is beyond it.
- Be courteous.
- Obey all wildlife laws.
- Know the weapon restriction in the area you are hunting.
- No loaded weapons in the parks.
