



HUNTING GUIDE

OOLOGAH LAKE

Hunting at Oologah Lake is in accordance with applicable Federal and state fish and wildlife regulations. Generally, all Corps lands are open to the public for hunting except developed recreational areas and lands around the lock & dam and other structures.

Hunters wishing to obtain current hunting regulations or construct duck blinds on Corps lands must contact the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation, 1801 N. Lincoln Blvd, Oklahoma City, OK 73105 (405) 521-2739.

Hunters are urged to exercise the basic rules of good sportsmanship, safety, and common sense.

Vehicles may be driven only on established roads and camping is restricted to designated sites.

RESTRICTED HUNTING

As the result of cooperative arrangements between the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation and the Tulsa District Corps of Engineers, several tracts of Corps lands have been made available to sportsmen for restricted hunting. With the exception of the special restrictions outlined below, all provisions of the Oklahoma Hunting Regulations for Corps of Engineers lands are applicable on these areas.

The following areas are open for hunting of all species which may legally be taken during legal open seasons by shotgun with pellets and archery.

- 1) An 80-acre unit on the east side of Blue Creek Park
- 2) A 180-acre unit on the south side of Spencer Creek Park
- 3) The 640-acre island (known as Goose Island) southeast of Sunnyside Ramp
- 4) A 120-acre unit east of Double Creek Cove Park
