C. SIGNIFICANT NEXUS DETERMINATION

Considerations when evaluating significant nexus include, but are not limited to the volume, duration, and frequency of the flow of water in the tributary and its proximity to a TNW, and the functions performed by the tributary and all its adjacent wetlands. It is not appropriate to determine significant nexus based solely on any specific threshold of distance (e.g. between a tributary and its adjacent wetland or between a tributary and the TNW). Similarly, the fact an adjacent wetland lies within or outside of a floodplain is not solely determinative of significant nexus.

Findings for: SWT-2014-303_ Intermittent Stream
This unnamed tributary has the potential to transfer nutrients and organic carbons to downstream food web during rain events to the TNW. This stream segment collects and transports water and sediments, and provides nutrient cycling, sediment retention, and filtration, all of which improves water quality of the TNW.
Therefore, the unnamed tributary has more than a speculative or insubstantial effect on the chemical, physical, and biological integrity of the downstream TNW due to their integral ecological relationship.
