
- 1. Purpose. The purpose of this supplement is to revise and update the public use area site plans to reflect as-built conditions and future development plans.
- 2. Scope of Work. The revised site plans were drawn from aerial photographs enlarged to a scale of one inch = 200 feet. All road alignments, facility locations, and shorelines were taken directly from the photographs. Field work was performed and coordinated with project personnel to determine the locations of individual campsites, picnic sites and utilities. Plans for future development were submitted by project personnel.
- 3. <u>Discussion</u>. The revised public use area site plans are necessary to maintain the master plan's usefulness as a working document and to plan for future development. All existing roads and facilities are shown, as well as all utility lines. - 4. Recommendation. I recommend that this supplement be approved as submitted.





- 1. <u>PURPOSE</u>. The purpose of this supplement is to request approval for the construction of an amphitheater adjacent to Canadian Recreation Area. This work will be accomplished with FY 88 SRUF funds.
- 2. JUSTIFICATION. Construction of an amphitheater will provide a more suitable facility for presentation of interpretive programs to the public. 

- 1. Purpose. The purpose of this supplement is to request authority to construct group shelters in the two areas that are presently being utilized for group campsites in the Canadian Recreation area. The work will be accomplished with FY 87 SRUF funds.
- Justification. Currently all Tulsa District projects are receiving more requests for use of this type of facility than they can accommodate. In every place where a shelter has been constructed both attendance and fee collections have shown a substantial increase with only slight increase in 0 & M costs. It is estimated that the proposed shelters will increase user fees by \$3,100 per year with an increase of \$150 per year in 0 & M cost.

- 1. Purpose. The purpose of this supplement is to propose the construction of a waterborne shower/toilet building in the Big Bend Recreation Area. The proposed work will be accomplished with FY 86 Funds.
- 2. Justification. Area "B" of the Big Bend Recreation has been rehabilitated and now contains sixty-four campsites. The existing sanitary facilities consist of two wood vault toilets which are inadequate to serve the needs of the visiting public and meet the health and sanitation codes that have been imposed by the state. It is anticipated that the upgrading of the campsites and the addition of a waterborne facility will bring about a significant increase in visitation. It will also qualify the park for reclassification to class "A" and allow an increase in user fees. With an increase in revenues and a predicted decrease in 0 & M costs the cost of the building should be recovered in five to six years.
- 3. Recommendation. I recommend that this supplement be approved as presented herein.
