








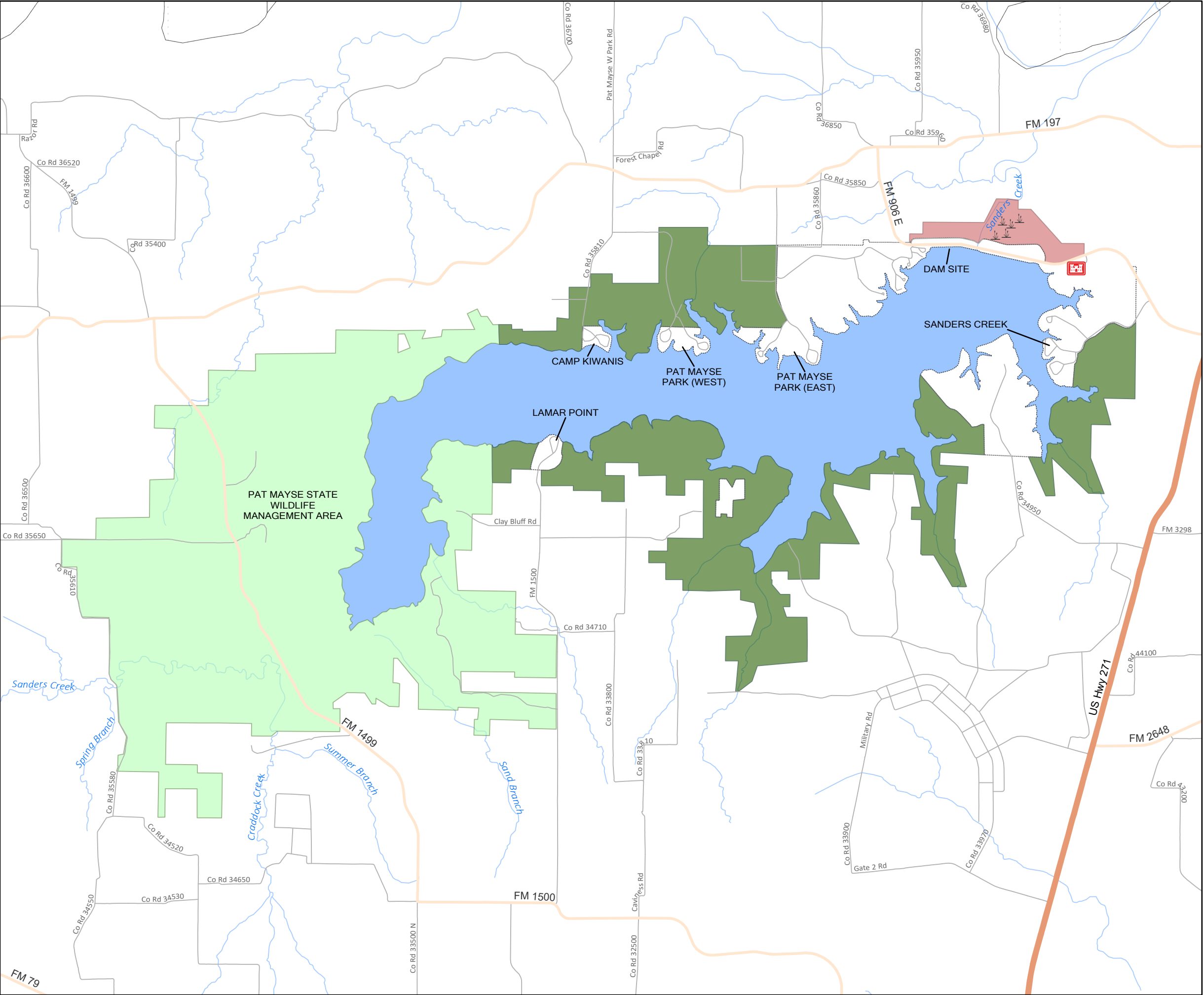


Pat Mayse Lake Hunting Areas

GENERAL HUNTING INFORMATION

PAT MAYSE LAKE

Hunting at Pat Mayse Lake is in accordance with applicable federal and state fish and wildlife regulations. Generally, all Corps lands are open to the public for hunting except developed recreational areas and lands around the dam and other structures. Hunting is permitted in designated project hunting areas with all legal weapons, except the restricted hunting area below the dam which is open to archery equipment and shotgun with pellets only, deer hunting is restricted to archery equipment. Hunting of waterfowl in the restricted area is limited to one-half hour before sunrise to noon. Nontoxic shot is required for hunting waterfowl within the state.

Hunters using the Pat Mayse Lake are urged to exercise the basic rules of good sportsmanship, safety, and common sense.

Vehicles may be driven only on established roads and trails, and camping is restricted to designated sites.
