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is exhibiting normal precipitation conditions, however
the graph for the last nine months depicts wetter than
01
average conditions. This feature is likely to have a
localized water table associated due to the presence of
a mapped forested wetland, and evidence of visible
water throughout the year, which may increase its
seasonal flow duration. There is the presence of a
visible natural channel in aerial imagery and confirmed
in site photos, the average channel width is
approximately 12 feet. Based on information from the
AFB, the site is likely influenced by beavers impounding
the stream. This tributary has been determined as an
intermittent tributary, immediately downstream of the
confluence of two headwater ephemeral streams.

This area is visibly inundated in numerous aerial imagery, supporting that this area is in fact a wetland. This wetland directly abuts the intermittent tributary within the review area, resulting in this wetland being jurisdictional.

- **B. Typical year assessment(s):** The APT tool was ran for January 27, 2021, which corresponds with this evaluation. The results of this report concluded that the site conditions are normal with a value of 14. The graph depicts conditions for approximately 7 months of the year, and the 30 year rolling average. This tool supports the conclusion of this determination.
- **C.** Additional comments to support AJD: The review area is within the Tinker AFB, and contains an unnamed tributary to Crutcho Creek, which was determined to be jurisdictional. The unnamed tributary has two ephemeral streams which flow directly into the jurisdictional tributary, both ephemeral streams are non-jurisdictional. The site also has a forested wetland which directly abuts the jurisdictional tributary.

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
